On March 25, 1911, in New York City, 146 young workers (mostly women) were burned, smothered or crushed to death in a fire at The Triangle Waist Company.

Leon Stein, Labor Editor, author and historian — for many years the editor of *Justice*, the newspaper of the International Ladies' Garment Workers' Union (ILGWU), tells the story. He is interviewed here by Joe Glazer.

Stein is the author of *The Triangle Fire, Out of the Sweatshop* and other books.
