INCIDENTAL MUSIC

Music on this record has been especially selected to function as background accompaniment for pantomime, whether on stage or on film. The variety afforded covers most short subject needs, and may be interlaced with appropriate literal sound effects from the Cook Sound Effects Vol. I & II.

Material includes percussion orchestra, harpsichord, music box, marimba, symphony orchestra, barrelhouse piano (nickelodeon) burlesque orchestra, pipe organ, calliope, and jungle drums.

The recording is rendered in compatible stereo and may be reproduced on any 331/3 RPM phonograph. The stereo aspec can be a definite dramatic advantage in the case of on-stage live theatricals.


Set the Stage
