

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You might call both of these albums (Volume I and Volume II) TRAVELLING SOCIAL STUDIES for children of *pre-school* to *six grade* level because the songs and rhymes take the children, listeners (instant participants) to and through many cities states countries and cultures, visiting wide and varied communities.

The songs and rhymes HOP AROUND FROM PLACE TO PLACE and from one situation to another — serious and humorous — teaching and learning. The children, the musicians and I try to stimulate the listener (participant) to STOP, LOOK and LISTEN in on many cultures and to find out more about peoples and places and to become better observers of their own communities — also to explore READING and LISTENING.

Our travels take us from CAIRO (KY-RO), EGYPT to CAIRO (KAY-RO), ILLINOIS, from OKEECHOBEE, FLORIDA to BUFFALO, NEW YORK, from different parts of TEXAS to THE AUSTRALIAN ZOO, from the fascinating NATIVE AMERICAN names of OREGON to THE LITTLE GREEN FROG THAT SITS BY THE STREAM, from cooking on a PIECKA (pronounced PI-ET-SKA), a SLOVAK word for STOVE — to climbing up a SWISS mountain, from playing the UKULELE IN LOVELY HAWAII to a CHILL ON HOLLYWOOD HILL and from there — UP IN SPACE . . .

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

I have traveled many a mile since having been born in Saint Louis, Missouri, grown up on the SOUTH SIDE OF CHICAGO and having graduated from San Francisco State University.

It feels rather good to say that I have traveled to ALL of the states in the United States, including Alaska and Hawaii. Each city, each state, each community, I found, had its own special charm; its own individuality. I'd like to travel around to more cities.

It has always been intriguing to me to hear the varied ACCENTS, DIALECTS, DRAWLS and SPEECH COLORINGS as I HOP AROUND FROM PLACE TO PLACE. Many people conclude that ALL Southerners sound alike. Try bending your ear and LISTEN more KEENLY and you'll find very definitely that South Carolinians don't sound like North Carolinians nor do Georgians sound like Floridians. Mississippians don't sound like Alabamians nor do Tennesseans sound like Virginians. If you traveled to the East and the Middle West you'll find that New Yorkers don't sound like Bostonians nor do Chicagoans sound like Philadelphians. We could travel a step further — to Spanish-speaking countries and find that Cubans don't sound like Puerto Ricans nor do Spaniards sound like Mexicans, Peruvians don't sound like Argentenians nor do Chileans sound like Costa Ricans.

In my HOPPING AROUND FROM PLACE TO PLACE I have also traveled to six continents of the world: AFRICA, NORTH AMERICA, SOUTH AMERICA, AUSTRALIA, ASIA and EUROPE. My next big travel ADVENTURE, hopefully, will be the ANTARTICA, completing the SEVEN CONTINENTS . . . Ella Jenkins

CHICAGO CHILDREN'S CHOIR

During the twenty seven years since its founding by CHRISTOPHER MOORE, the Chicago Children's Choir has provided a very special kind of music and human relations education to the thousands of boys and girls who have participated in its programs and an equally special education to the hundreds of thousands of people who have heard the choir's concert teams in performance.

The choir's 450 participants come from all over the Chicago area and from varying racial, cultural, economic and religious backgrounds. They are accepted in auditions and usually spend at least two years learning choral skills and vocal production before they earn promotion to the performance group. It is not unusual for singers to begin their training in third grade and to continue singing with the choir through high school. Boys with changed voices are taught to use their new voices in the men's chorus.

The choir's audiences are youngsters in Chicago area schools, both suburban and inner city, who hear the group in school concerts and become more interested in their own music making. They are Chicago area residents who are familiar with the choir from its appearance at civic functions, at downtown plazas, in concert, on television, radio and records, or who attend a concert by another prestigious music ensemble or a production by a visiting ballet company and find the performance augmented by a choir team. They are the people who have heard the Chicago Children's Choir in the past seventeen years on any of their two or three annual concert tours in cities all over the eastern United States and Canada and, in 1970, in England, Denmark and Germany. For many of these audiences, the Chicago Children's Choir has become a new and affirmative symbol of Chicago.

THE GROUP HEARD ON THIS RECORD CONSISTS OF BOYS AND GIRLS, MOSTLY FOURTH AND FIFTH GRADERS, WHO HAVE BEEN PART OF THE CHICAGO CHILDREN'S CHOIR PROGRAM FOR LESS THAN A YEAR. AS MEMBERS OF THE SUMMER 1983 WORKSHOP THEY WERE HEARD BY ELLA JENKINS AND INVITED TO BE A PART OF THIS RECORD.

COMMENTS ABOUT SOME OF THE SONGS

I have only commented on the songs where I thought it was necessary. Most of the songs have introductions or have clear inferences as to how they should be used.

I THINK I'LL GO TO OREGON ...

This song was inspired by my working in OREGON over the past ten years — I worked for Portland State University, Oregon State University and for a few children's associations. And "there are many, many things to do."

I bought and ate a lot of TILLAMOOK cheese and it was delicious - it was in a little community called TILLAMOOK where the TILLAMOOK FACTORY is — I bought the cheese there.

One of my students, KAY, at CANNON BEACH, OREGON, worked with the UMATILLA TRIBE in PENDLETON, OREGON.

The OREGON TRAIL was a 2,000-mile trail used in WESTERN migrations from MISSOURI to OREGON.

THEY PLAY THE UKULELE IN LOVELY HAWAII ...

KA-ME-HA-ME-HA was KING of the HAWAIIAN ISLANDS from 1810 to 1819. On June 11th of each year "K" DAY is celebrated - KA-ME-HA-ME-HA DAY.

I KNOW A CITY CALLED OKEECHOBEE ...

OKEECHOBEE IS A SEMINOLE INDIAN NAME, meaning "BIG WATER" . . . I was never in OKEECHO-BEE but on my way from Belle Glade, Florida, heading down the highway, I saw a big sign that read "OKEECHO-BEE"....I immediately took to the name. I asked my driver, "where is Okeechobee?"....She answered, "it's right near PAHOKEE."

It usually strikes on the hour, but when four o'clock came BIG BEN was SILENT.

The clock was named after SR. BENJAMIN HALL — it was installed in the TOWER in 1858.




