FOLK SONGS OF THE SMOKY MOUNTAINS

LIKE EVERYONE IN THE UNITED STATES, THE PEOPLE OF THE GREAT SMOKY MOUN-TAIN REGION HAVE A VARIED ANCESTRY. THEIR SONGS ARE FLAVORED WITH A HINT OF ENGLISH, SCOTCH AND IRISH ORIGIN, FOR THESE MOUNTAIN PEOPLE ARE DESCENDANTS OF THE SCOTCH, IRISH AND ENGLISH WHO SETTLED THIS PART OF AMERICA.

MUSIC PLAYS AN IMPORTANT PART IN THE LIFE OF THE MOUNTAIN PEOPLE. NO MATTER HOW HUMBLE, THERE ARE FEW IF ANY, HOMES THAT DO NOT HAVE A BANJO, GUITAR, FIDDLE OR ZITHER. MANY A MOUNTAINEER GAN BE FOUND WHOSE LIST OF PIECES IS SO EXTEN-SIVE THAT HE GAN MAKE MUSIC FOR HOURS AT A TIME WITHOUT EVER REPEAT-ING A NUMBER. WHOLE FAMILIES MAKE MUSIG, SING AND ¹CUT A STEP¹, FROM GRANDMA DOWN TO THE ¹LEAST ¹UN¹.

LOUISIANA FOLK SONGS (CREOLE)

FOR THE MAIN PART, LOUISIANA FOLK MUBIC IS CREOLE, CREOLE FOLK SONGS ORIGINATED ON THE PLANTATIONS OF THE FRENCH AND SPANISH COLONISTS OF LOUIS-IANA. THE CREOLE NEGRO LEARNED THE FOREIGN TONGUES BY EAR, AND ADAPTED THE LANGUAGE TO HIS OWN WAY OF SPEAK-ING. THAT LANGUAGE IS STILL SPOKEN IN MANY PARTS OF LOUISIANA TODAY; IT IS A PATOIS, SOFT AND FULL OF FLAVOR, THAT LENDS ITSELF WELL TO THE HAUNTINGLY BEAUTIFUL CREOLE SONGS.

GREOLE FOLK SONGS FALL INTO SIX CLASSIFICATIONS. THE SONGS THAT STEM FROM DANCE FORMS, THE COUNJAI, THE CALINDA, THE BAMBOULA, THE JUBA OR NONSENSE DANCE, THE SPANISH HABANERA AND THE QUADRILLE. THERE IS THE ONE EXCEPTION, A PURE MARTIAL AIR "EN AVANT GRENADIE". THE TEXTS MIGHT BE SAID TO BELONG IN SIX CLASSIFICATIONS ALSO'S RIDICULE, ROMANTIC, LULLABY, TAUNTING, FOOD AND NARRATIVE.

TAN PATATE-LA TCHUITE (COLLECTED BY MINA MONROE)

THIS IS ONE OF THE POPULAR 'BAMBOULA' SONGS OF NEW ORLEANS, IT IS AN INVITA-TICN TO JOIN IN, A PERSUASIVE APPETI-ZER TO DINNER.

EN AVANT GRENADIE (COLLECTED BY HENRI WEHRMANN))


"EN AVANT GRENADIE" CONTAINS THE ONLY MARTIAL ALLUSION TO BE FOUND IN LOUISIANA CREOLE SONGS. IT IS STILL POPULAR IN LOUISIANA AND IT IS NOT CONSIDERED AN UNFITTING MELODY TO BE USED AS A FUNERAL MARCH ON GRAND OCCA-SIONS.

[†]FORWARD MARCH, GRENADIERS! HE WHO GETS SHOT SHALL GET NO RATIONS. FORWARD MARCH, HE WHO GETS SHOT, FOR HIM THE WORSE. GRENADIERS ARE NOT AFRAID OF DANGER. THOSE WHO ARE KILLED, BAD LUCK TO THEM.[†]

¹MY DEAR FRIENDS, I WILL TELL YOU THE STGRY OF SABIN AND ROSALIE. WHEN LOUIS LAINE PASSED HER HOUSE HE HEARD SABIN SAY³ "WORK, WORK, ROSALIE; SAW WOOD, I NEED SHOES, SHOES THAT I SHALL WEAR TO DANCE THE <u>BAMBOULA</u> AND THE <u>FANDANGO</u>. BUT WITH ALL HIS BIG TALK, SABIN IS RIDICULOUS; HE LOOKS JUST LIKE A RABBIT WHEN HE DANCES.
