INTRODUCTION AND NOTES ON THE RECORDINGS BY CHARITY BAILEY AND EUNICE HOLSAERT

DIRECTIONS FOR USING THIS RECORD

FIND YOURSELF A PRIVATE PLAGE. A ROOM EIGHT FEET WIDE AND TEN FEET LONG, WOULD BE FINE. BE SURE THERE'S AOTHING BREAKABLE AROUND SO YOU WON'T JIGGLE IT LOOSE WHEN YOU START DANCING. SET YOUR RECORD PLAYER AT 33 I/3 RPM, START WITH "BRASS WAGON". YOU ARE NOW SIX YEARS OLD, OR MAYBE FIVE, OR SEVEN.

AS YOU GO OVER THIS RECORD I AM SURE THAT YOU WILL NOTICE THAT MUCH OF THE MATERIAL USED IS MORE DELIBERATELY PLANNED THAN THE CHILDREN WILL REALIZE. THE PRIMARY PURPOSE OF THE RECORD IS FOR THEM TO HAVE A JOYFUL MUSICAL EXPERIENCE. IF THEY DO YOU CAN BE SURE THAT THEY WILL LEARN SOME ELEMENTS OF MUSIC FROM IT.

FOR EXAMPLE, AS YOU KEEP PLAYING OVER THE MATERIAL YOU, AS A TEACHER, WILL REALIZE THAT THE FOLK SONG I HAVE CHOSEN AS THE "LEARNING SONG" HAS SO MANY REPEATED WORDS THAT THE CHILDREN ARE NOT BURDENED DOWN WITH A TIRESOME MEMORIZING JOB AND CAN START SINGING AND ENJOYING THEMSELVES IMMEDIATELY. REALIZATIONS LIKE THIS WILL HELP YOU IN CHOOSING NEW SONGS FOR YOUR CLASS.

JUST TO GIVE YOU ANOTHER EXAMPLE TO MAKE SURE THAT OUR THINKING IS RUNNING ALONG THE SAME CHANNELS: YOU'LL FIND WHEN YOU'VE PRE-DIGESTED THIS MATERIAL AND ARE READY TO PLAY THIS RECORD FOR YOUR CHILDREN THAT THE MORE MUSICAL CHILDREN WILL SOON BEGIN USING TWO MUSICAL PHRASES TO TELL THEIR STORY IN THE "MAKE-UP SONG". IT WILL NOT BE LONG BEFORE YOU WILL KNOW HOW TO HELP GUIDE SUCH INDIVIDUAL DIFFERENCES. ALSO, YOU WILL BE AWARE, THOUGH THE CHILDREN WILL NOT, THAT THE "RHYTHM SONG" WAS PLANNED TO GIVE CHILDREN THE EXPERIENCE OF CLAPPING BOTH THE BEAT AND OF CLAPPING THE PATTERN OF THE MELODY. IN CHOOSING FURTHER MATERIAL OF THIS TYPE YOU WILL WANT TO DECIDE BEFOREHAND WHAT RHYTHMIC ELEMENTS YOU WISH TO TEACH.

BUT ABOVE ALL, REMEMBER -- HAVE FUN!

COMMENTS

THE RESPONSE OF THE CHILDREN TO THE RECORDS WAS IMMEDIATE AND WONDERFUL. THE CHILDREN EASILY PICKED UP THE WORDS OF THE SONGS AND THE ACTIVITY SIDE OF "LITTLE BRASS WAGON" SPONTANEOUSLY EVOKED A ROOM FULL OF WAGONS -- FOUR WHEELED WAGONS, THREE WHEELED WAGONS, AND TWO WHEELED WAGONS. THE CHILDREN WERE VERY INGENIOUS ABOUT THIS. SEVERAL TIMES THEY WERE ON ALL FOURS, THEN ONE ANKLE WOULD DANGLE IN THE AIR, THEY WOULD ROLL OVER ON THEIR BACKS WITH BOTH LEGS WAVING. WE REPEATED THE RECORD THREE TIMES AND STILL THE CHILDREN WANTED TO CONTINUE.

BEFORE USING THE RECORDS WITH THE CHILDREN THE TEACHERS LISTENED TO THEM SEVERAL TIMES TO BECOME THOROUGHLY FAMILIAR WITH THE SONGS. IN THIS WAY WE KNEW JUST AT WHAT PART OF THE RECORD TO PICK UP THE NEEDLE ACCORDING TO THE CHILDREN'S RESPONSE.

FOR US THESE RECORDS HAVE A NEW, REFRESHING QUALITY, AND THERE WAS NO QUESTION IN OUR MINDS THAT THEY COULD BE USED OVER AND OVER AGAIN IN A VARIETY OF WAYS.
