

I ENJOY THE FACT THAT I AM ABLE TO OFFER TO OTHERS SOMETHING THAT I AM CAPABLE OF DOING. IT IS MY PLEASURE AND HAS BEEN MY GREATEST HONOR AND PRIVILEGE TO HAVE BEEN PLACED IN THIS MOST REWARDING POSITION.

I BEGAN WORKING WITH CHILDREN WHEN I WAS A CHILD. I TAUGHT MY THREE YOUNGER SISTERS, GLYCERINE, OLLIE AND JANICE, EVERYTHING THAT I LEARNED IN SCHOOL. DURING THAT TIME, NOBODY COULD HAVE TOLD ME THAT MY PROFESSION WOULD BE WORKING WITH CHILDREN. WELL, IT'S TRUE, AND I LOVE IT.

THROUGH THE YEARS, I HAVE APPEARED ON THE SAME PROGRAM WITH ISSAC HAYES, O.C. SMITH, WILSON PICKETT, JERRY BUTLER, MARVIN GAYE, NIKKI GIOVANNI (COMMUNITY CHOIR) ETC.

I ALSO WORKED WITH "LISTEN MY BROTHER" (FROM THE WORLD FAMOUS APOLLO THEATER).

I WAS VOCAL COACH, WRITER, ARRANGER, FOR LORETTA LONG, WHO PLAYS SUSAN ON (SESAME STREET). I WROTE THE ALPHABET SONG, ALSO COUNT FROM 1 THROUGH 20 FOR HER CHILDREN'S ALBUM, WHICH MADE HER ALBUM A BIG SUCCESS.

BY LISTENING, AND SINGING ALONG WITH THIS ALBUM, I HOPE THAT IT WILL GIVE EVERY CHILD THE AMBITION, EAGERNESS, AND THE DESIRE TO LEARN, BECAUSE THIS IS SOMETHING THAT THEY NEED TO HELP THEM START LIFE IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION.
