

His mother finally realized he was one of those youngsters who doesn't believe fat meat is greasy so she said, "All right. Go over it." After school that day he rushed down the lane and started his climb-confident and secure. Soon the bramble bushes were scratching at his legs, the little insects were buzzing his ankles and the sun was beaming directly on his head. The mountain seemed to grow steeper with each step. He finally reached the top only to understand, to his horror, that he had to inch his way down as he had inched his way up. There is probably an adult lesson in that story somewhere 'cause I'm thirty-three years old and I still remember it.
