Haiti has a wealth of music almost unparalleled elsewhere in the Caribbean, ranging from the traditional songs and dances of the countryside to the entertainment music of the urban centers. The dance music heard in Port-au-Prince sometimes draws for inspiration upon both the music of other islands and upon the folksongs and dances of the mountain villages. New songs are created every day by singers in dance bands, by street singers, and by the singing leaders of Codoun cult centers. The repertoires of bands such as the Ibo Combo may change completely from month to month as new songs appear. Sometimes those new songs may be reminiscent of Spanish-style singing in the Dominican Republic or Cuba, or of old folk tunes heard in the fields and in peasant homes in the mountains.

A large segment of the city songs is composed of romantic themes, many of them nostalgic. André Charles who composes most of the songs his group performs, frequently names his pieces after women. It is difficult to mention a girl's name known to Haitians that is not a title for one of his tunes. And his other titles also reflect the romantic themes running through his repertoire. Thus we have "A la Belle Bagaille," or "Beautiful Thing," referring, of course, to a beautiful girl; "Marie"; "Femme Qui Belle"; or "Beautiful Woman"; "Jeannette Cherie": "Maman'm:" "Coté Ou Yé?" or "Sweetheart, Where Are You?" and so on.

Here and there one hears songs rooted more in the countryside or in Vodoun religious tradition. "Plat Creole," for example, alludes to the food eaten in peasant country homes. It begins with the name Zaka (Azaka), an allusion to the special deity of country people and farmers, and recites the foods provided by Zaka for his "children." And "Cérémonie Farine" refers to a ritual of the Vodoun cult. This song normally would be accompanied only be rattle and by drums, but André Charles has introduced it here with his own guitar accompaniment.
