I think of poetry as being autobiographical. That doesn't mean all poets put their lives between the pages of a book but it does mean, at least to me, that we who write believe our poems. A couple of years ago Marion Williams, the gospel singer, recorded a song that says "I've got to live the life I sing about in my songs..." I think that goes further than an artist should ask of herself. Many of the themes I've explored in my poetry I couldn't possibly know...but I do believe old women are within the scope of my interest. And though I've never experienced starvation I do understand that in this world starvation is unacceptable.

Like any writer I have looked for a writing voice. I prefer

the first person singular or plural because I do believe we will do it together...whatever it is. Live and love; live and hate. Create a better world; destroy the one we have. Unlike some theoreticians I do not believe we are either a part of the problem or a part of the solution. I think we are a part of both. And since this is our world we must take responsibility for it.

Those who have gone before and those who are yet to be birthed—it is to these that we owe our legacies. I am hopeful we are at least as strong as our foreparents and I am confident we will be as intelligent as the next century requires.
