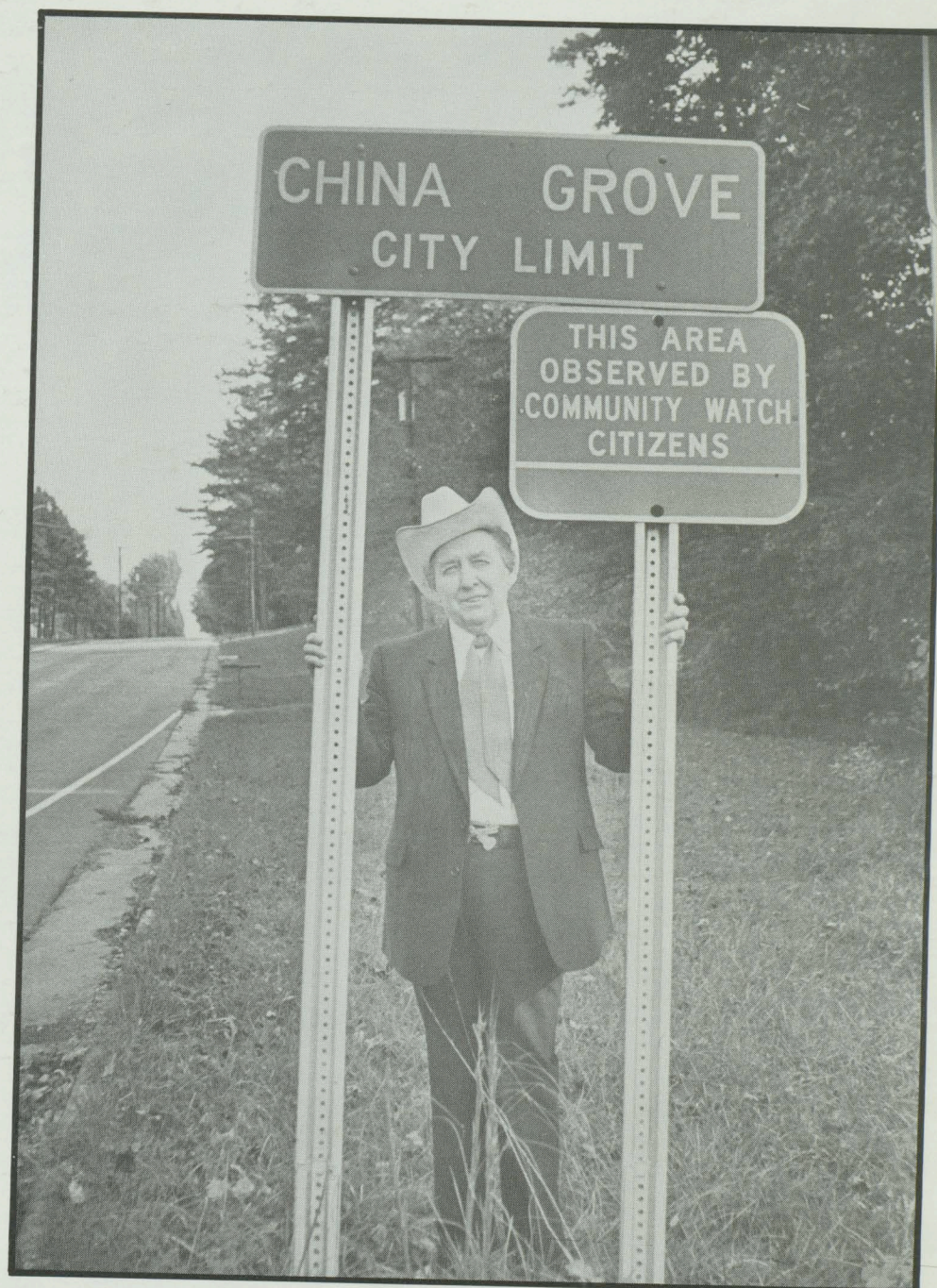

Here are some ways of recognizing an old sound. The Nashville Grass, one of the big names in Blue Grass Music. Curly Seckler is leader of this group since Lester's passing. He comes back with a hard drive in this album singing tenor that he handles so well. His new lead singer from Summertown, Tennessee, Willis Spears took a big part with Curly and the band in May of 81. We are able to come now with what I was raised on, a good style especially our quartet with Kenny Ingram on lead guitar and banjo. Curly says he likes that old drive that we had year in and year out. Johnny Warren plays a good Blue Grass fiddle with a tone that only a Warren can do. And he also sings a great bass, as you will hear in this album. We do a number here with just the fiddle and banjo, Johnny with some singing on it. Just about all this album you will hear Gene Wooten on dobro and J. T. Gray on bass. And there is a China Grove, North Carolina. Mayor Gilbert Mesimer, Curly says he has been a great leader for 20 years, My Hometown.
