BACK HOME IN SULPHUR SPRINGS

Sulphur Springs - Although Norman was born in Chattanooga, from age eleven months to twelve years he was raised by parents Rufus and Lorraine in one of the log houses on the Blake's old home place in Sulphur Springs. It's the same property where Great Grandfather R.I.G. Blake was born in 1829. R.I.G, in his later years, lost an eye as a quartermaster in the Confederate Army and eventually returned to Sulphur Springs and ran a legal, bonded whiskey still. Grandfather Larkin worked as a coach carpenter for the railroad and built the log houses on the Blake property. It was in one of those homes in Sulphur Springs where Grandmother Blake lived while Great Grandmother Cames resided about a half

mile away, down by the water tanks. Both worked for a time down the gravel road at the depot as telegraphers for the Alabama Great Southern.

The small community of Sulphur Springs is just 25 miles from Chattanooga and sits right on the Georgia & Alabama line. The old one room schoolhouse was converted into the Stateline Methodist Church. It was said the congregation sat in Alabama while the preacher stood in Georgia. The Blake's home in Sulphur Springs was on the Georgia side while Norman's parents, grandparents and great grandparents, along with many other relatives and friends, continue to rest in the cemetery on the Alabama side. Norman recalls the wood stove, the flat iron, no electricity and the friendly tenants on the property who had a victrola and hillbilly records. That was followed by the Zenith radio that, with proper tuning, offered live music. It was there that Grandmother Blake taught him his first tune on guitar, Spanish Fandango in open G tuning.

Now accomplished on dobro and mandolin as well as guitar, Norman's subsequent musical journeys are well documented. The recordings of Johnny Cash, The Carters, Kris Kristofferson, Joan Baez, Bob Dylan and John Hartford are among the notable many.

In 1972, Norman returned to his musical roots for his first solo record, *Home In Sulphur Springs*. Shortly after Rounder Records released this now critically acclaimed recording, Norman met cello player Nancy Short of Independence, Missouri. Norman and Nancy married in 1975 and not long afterwards, they built their two story home in Rising Fawn, Georgia, where they still live. Rising Fawn is at the Southern end of Dade County, off the old Lee Highway, in the Cove of Johnson's Crook, beneath Lookout Mountain, three and one half miles from the Home In Sulphur Springs.



Colorado Springs - In the Summer of 2004, thirty years and twenty some recordings later, Norman & Nancy Blake returned to the old railroad warehouse by the tracks in Colorado Springs. In more recent years, the 1887 Santa Fe Railroad building has become the home of Western Jubilee Recording Company where the Blakes have recorded on several occasions. Their previous visit resulted in Plectrafone Records and the Grammy nominated duet recording. *The Morning Glory Ramblers*.

Norman is now celebrating more than thirty years of not getting on an airplane and the sessions are generally tied to a Colorado festival appearance. As in the past, the Blakes along with their dog, Bascom, parked their 'home on the road' travel rig by the railroad tracks just outside the warehouse studio. This time, it took more trips than before to unload all the vintage string instruments carried from Rising Fawn in their new and much improved RV that "O Brother" paid for. As always, good friend and Recording Engineer Butch Hause had pre-set the room

Since, Norman's directions have been clear:

"Nancy & I are liking these tunes quite a bit, let's get it out there." "Might as well have two recordings on Plectrafone." "Let Butch mix them, I know he won't change them too much." "Let's call it *Back Home In Sulphur Springs*. The first record was a title only. Now I've written the song, plus it's 'back home." "That photo you took at the end of the sessions with our new hats and new Blake model Martins will work for the cover." "Just leave them in the order we recorded them ... plays pretty good." "Don't think I'll write song notes. Just let them speak for themselves."

So, here it is – and proud to capture another great collection of songs from America's #1 purveyors of Old Time Country Music
