

It is an enriching, soul satisfying experience to write a song about America's greatest folk hero. It gives me a feeling that I am doing something that has meaning historically, educationally, ethically, as well as artistically. The wholesome themes, the rugged but aesthetic quality of the music sends out a beautiful note of encouragement and hope every time it is played. So saddle up and ride with us through these songs, and I can guarantee that you will see in your imagination plenty of Horses, Cattle and Coyotes.


