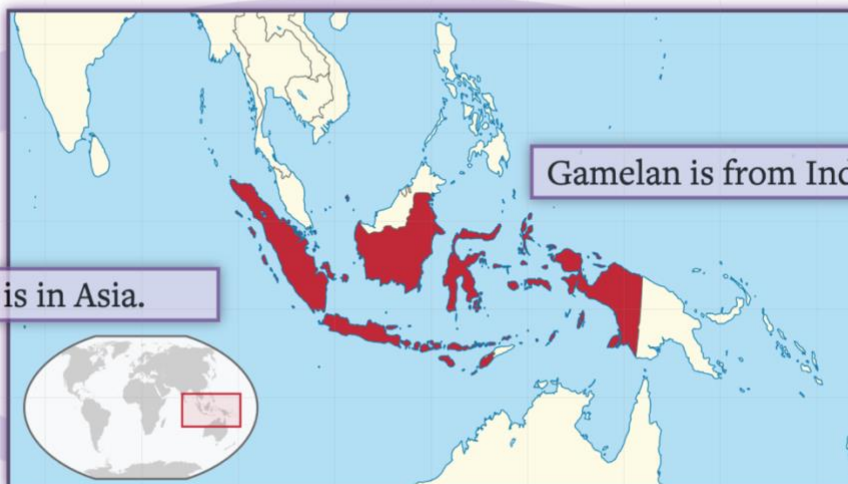

This is called a *gong*.



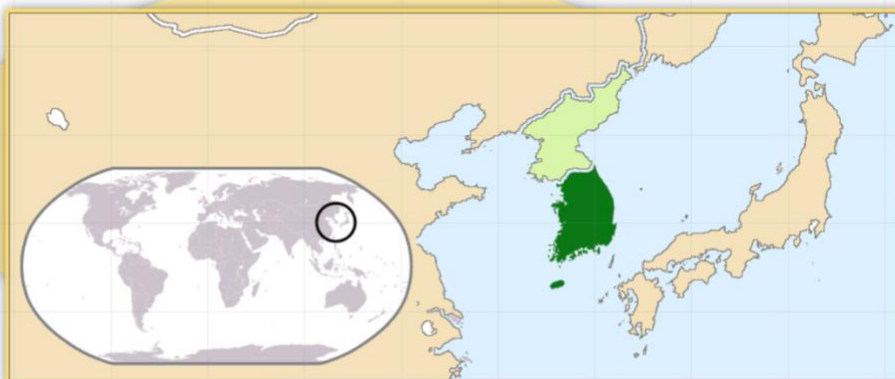
