## KENNY WINFREE

This is Kenny Winfree's first recording and it is a winner. You can bet it won't be his last.

Kenny is this generation's Woody Guthrie. He has the same knack for writing catchy, moving songs with a message —songs that are easy to sing and easy to remember.

When you hear such great songs as DOWN AT THE UNION HALL, I'M A UNION CARD or SNAKE OIL, you sing along with them and say to yourself, "How come I didn't write something like that? Looks easy." Kenny Winfree's got a talent that looks easy but few folks can do it.

Kenny lives in Lebanon, Tennessee near Nashville. He worked in a textile mill which he tried to organize and now works in an aircraft plant organized by the International Association of Machinists (IAM). He is an active officer of Local 735, IAM. He also belongs to the local Musicians' Union. Says Kenny:

"Belonging to two unions makes it twice as good."

Kenny is devoting his considerable musical and poetic talents to songs for working people. He has appeared at union rallies, organizing meetings, conventions and assorted fish fries and chicken dinners. He was a featured performer in the AFL-CIO movie, SINGIN' FOR THE UNION and has been a three-time participant in the Great Labor Song Exchange sponsored by the Labor Heritage Foundation. You'll be hearing a lot about Kenny in the days to come.
